



Pupil Voice Meeting - Head Boy/Girl & House Captains

Minutes

1	Present	Chair: Mr Dobberson (Assistant Head); Ethan (Head Boy); Aafreen, Alfie, Mckayla, Oliver, Chloe, Callum, Gabriella, Nathan (House Captains).
2	Apologies	Hope Head Girl).
3	KS2 House Sports Competition	<p>It was emphasised that all house competitions should be inclusive, meaning all pupils would take part. In order to achieve this, all competitions would need to be held for each year group.</p> <p>After discussion, it was agreed that this half-term the competition would once again be a netball-style competition. In order to make matches higher scoring, and, therefore, more exciting, points would be given for hitting the post, and possibly extra points for actually scoring in the hoop. Teams would consist of 8 players, and any substitutes would come on at half-time, meaning that every pupil would play for at least half the time in each match. Competitions would have two semi-finals, a 3rd/4th play-off, and a final.</p> <p>The House Captains agreed to act as managers for the House Teams at each of the year group's competition (with a particular focus on ensuring all pupils got to take part), and the Head Boy and Girl agreed to assist staff in the timing and keeping score of matches.</p> <p>Mr Dobberson agreed to explain the rules of all the competitions to staff and put together a timetable (by Friday 19th October).</p>
4	KS1 House Sports Competition	It was agreed that the KS1 event would also be a netball-style competition, but would be purely shooting, in which all pupils would participate for their House Team by trying to score as many 'hits' in a 5 to 10 minute period. Each pupil would have their shot, and then return to the back of the House Team's line for further attempts. The House Captains agreed to run, time and score the event.
5	1918-2018 100 Years Remembrance Thank You	<p>A suggestion was made that the next half-term's House Competition could be football matches played in 'the spirit' of the football matches played across No-Man's Land on Christmas Day 1914. The idea came from a suggestion by the Royal British Legion as a way to remember and say 'Thank You' to all those who served in the First World War (which is a campaign being promoted this year).</p> <p>Players could wear outfits from the period – or possibly not wear sports kit – and goals would be coats. Teams could also swap gifts.</p> <p>Mr Dobberson agreed to look further into the suggestion.</p>
6	House	The House Captains were asked to come up with ideas for this year's



	Christmas Quiz Competitions	House Christmas Quiz Competition, and were reminded about what has happened in previous years.
7	House Competitions 2018/19	<p>The House Captains agreed that there should be one sporting and one non-sporting competition per term in KS1, but in KS2 there would be an additional sporting one each term.</p> <p>After discussion, they provisionally agreed to the following: Autumn Term: Netball and a Christmas Quiz, plus football in KS2. Spring Term: Road Relays and an Easter Egg Hunt, plus hockey in KS2. Summer Term: Athletics and a General Knowledge Quiz, plus cricket or rounders in KS2.</p>
8	House Prizes	<p>The group liked the current house prizes of a film, a party and a sporting activity with Premier Sport, and provisionally agreed to: Autumn Term: Film, drink and popcorn. Spring Term: Easter party. Summer Term: Sporting activity with Premier Sport.</p> <p>It was noted that now Premier Sport are in school every day, they may be able to offer new House Prizes.</p>
9	Remembrance Services	<p>Mr Dobberson thanked the Heads and House Captains for taking part in the Remembrance Service at the National Memorial Arboretum.</p> <p>He then explained that St Chad's would once again be participating in the Royal Stoke University Hospital's Remembrance Service, and that he would like the Head Boy & Girl and the House Captains to represent the school. This year the Service was being held on Friday 9th November. Mr Dobberson would write an appropriate script, and this, along with a letter to parents, would be sent out before half-term.</p>
10	Video	<p>Mr Dobberson explained that it was hoped that video presentation about Pupil Voice could be produced before the next full meeting of the Governing Body, and that the Head Boy and Girl, along with the House Captains, would take responsibility for this (with the assistance of Mr Dobberson). Mrs Hunt offered to take responsibility for the filming itself. It was noted that the year's first full Governing Body meeting was on 17th October. Mr Dobberson agreed to draft a script and contact Mrs Hunt by 28th September when filming would commence.</p>
