



**Pupil Voice Meeting - Head Boy/Girl & House Captains**

**Friday 18<sup>th</sup> October 2019**

**Minutes**

<b>1</b>	Present	Chair: Mr Dobberson (Assistant Head); Mrs Hunt (Governor), Devin K (Head Boy), Tilly P-L (Head Girl); Lucie B, Ellie C, Evie D, Owen E, Sidney H, Noah H, Harry L, Tia S (House Captains).
<b>2</b>	Apologies	None.
<b>3</b>	Prayer	Read.
<b>4</b>	House Captain Responsibilities	Mr Dobberson explained that the House Captains had more responsibilities than collecting House points once every four weeks and helping in the dinner hall once a week, and noted some disappointment that none of the Captains had so far contacted the appropriate Teacher for their House (and that two House assemblies had already taken place). He asked that all the Captains do this as a matter of urgency.
<b>5</b>	House Sports Competition	<p>It was explained that this half-term's house competition, which had previously been agreed to be netball (with some amendments), would be taking place on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> October (Y3 &amp; Y4) and Friday 26<sup>th</sup> October (Y1, Y2, Y5 &amp; Y6).</p> <p>The rules were explained, along with the scoring and substitution rules, which would ensure higher scoring games and the required that every pupils participates. KS1 competitions would involve pupils having shots in a continuous relay; the KS2 competitions would have matches, with two semi-finals, a 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> play-off, and a final.</p> <p>The House Captains would run the KS1 competitions (including timing and keeping score) and would act as managers for the House Teams at in the KS2 competitions (with a particular focus on ensuring all pupils got to take part); the Head Boy and Girl would also assist in the timing and keeping score of matches.</p>
<b>6</b>	House Christmas Quiz Competitions	The House Captains were asked to come up with ideas for this year's House Christmas Quiz Competition, and were reminded about what has happened in previous years.
<b>7</b>	RSUH Remembrance Service	Mr Dobberson explained that St Chad's would once again be participating in the Royal Stoke University Hospital's Remembrance Service, and that he would like the Head Boy & Girl and the House Captains to represent the school. This year the Service was being held on Monday 11 <sup>th</sup> November. Mr Dobberson handed out a poem to be read at the event, and pupils practised reading it, before having a section given to learn over the half-term break. A letter was also given to the pupils regarding the event.
<b>8</b>	Remembrance Products	Mr Dobberson informed the Head Boy & Girl, and the House Captains, that in the first week after the half-term break, they will be selling poppies and a variety of other products for the Royal British Legion. This will happen each morning from 8;25am until the whistle is blown for start of school.
