

ART: Drawing pictures of toys past and present using tones and textures by adding lines. Using materials, textures and colour to create toy pictures in the style of Andy Warhol. Discussing how Andy Warhol has used texture and colour in his work.

D&T: Demonstrating a range of joining techniques using glue and materials to create a toy.

Using electricity to make a home for my chosen toy.
Preparing ingredients hygienically and safely and measuring using simple scales or cups to make cakes/biscuits at Christmas.

MUSIC: Children will choose sounds and create their own sequence of long and short sounds to recreate the sounds of a toy shop. Using symbols and signs to record their sequences and then Play their pieces to the rest of the class.



HISTORY: Children will discuss the changes in their lives and the lives of their parents and grandparents in terms of what everyone played with. Children will handle toy artefacts and discuss/discover what they were used for and how they were played—discussing the changes in materials. Finding out about a significant person from the past—looking at Theodore Roosevelt/Richard Steiff and their links to the teddy bear.

GEOGRAPHY: Naming and locating the four countries and the capital cities of the UK through a teddy arriving from each of the four countries. Identifying and discussing the characteristics of the four countries of the UK.

SCIENCE: In Science we will be identifying the different materials toys are made from and discussing the properties of these materials. We will also be comparing materials to find out why some are better than others for certain objects e.g. Raincoats, underpants and toy cars.
